METHODOLOGY



In-depth narrative interviews with 20 municipalities, two safety regions, and national actors.



Qualitative interviews with 10 active community leaders.

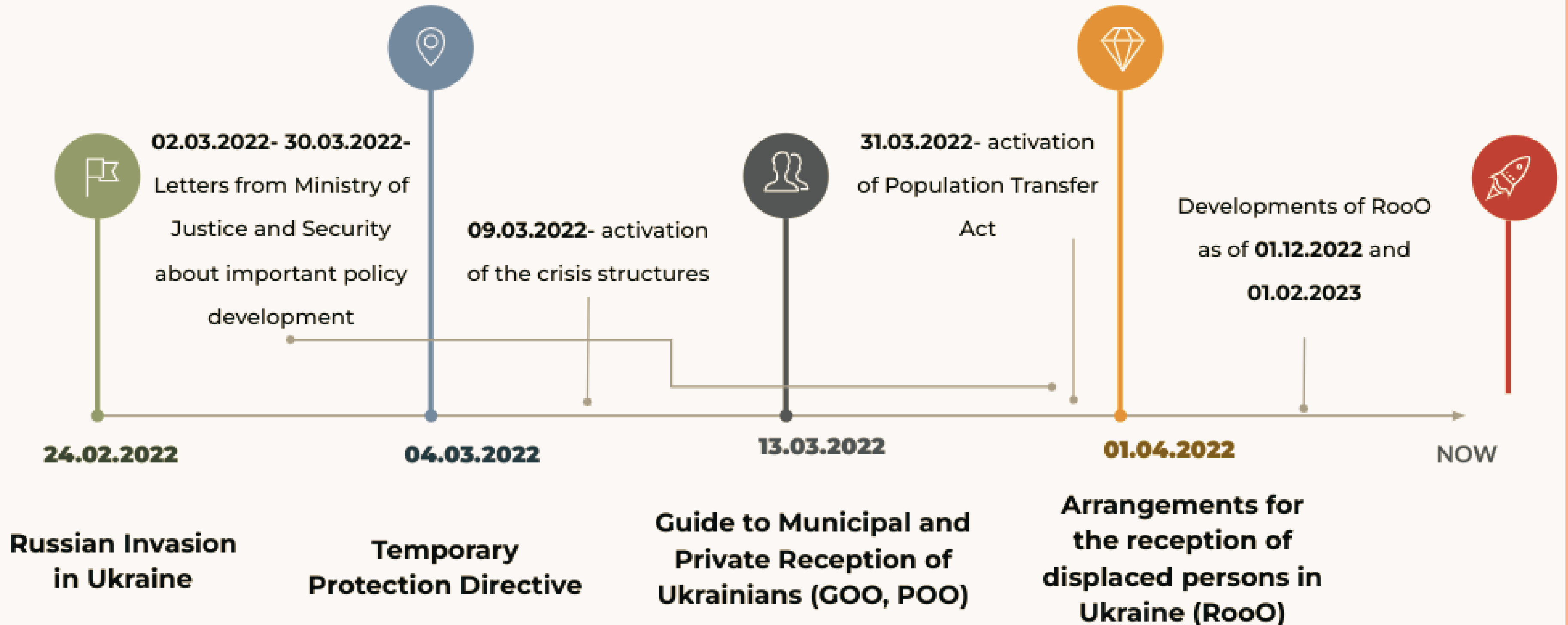


A survey, distributed to forcibly displaced through Telegram channels and community representatives. In total 335 responses were collected.



Analysis of more than 11,000 messages related to housing from DPU. We also collected and analysed available housing offers in various Telegram channels using natural language processing models.

Experiences of municipalities in accommodating displaced persons from Ukraine



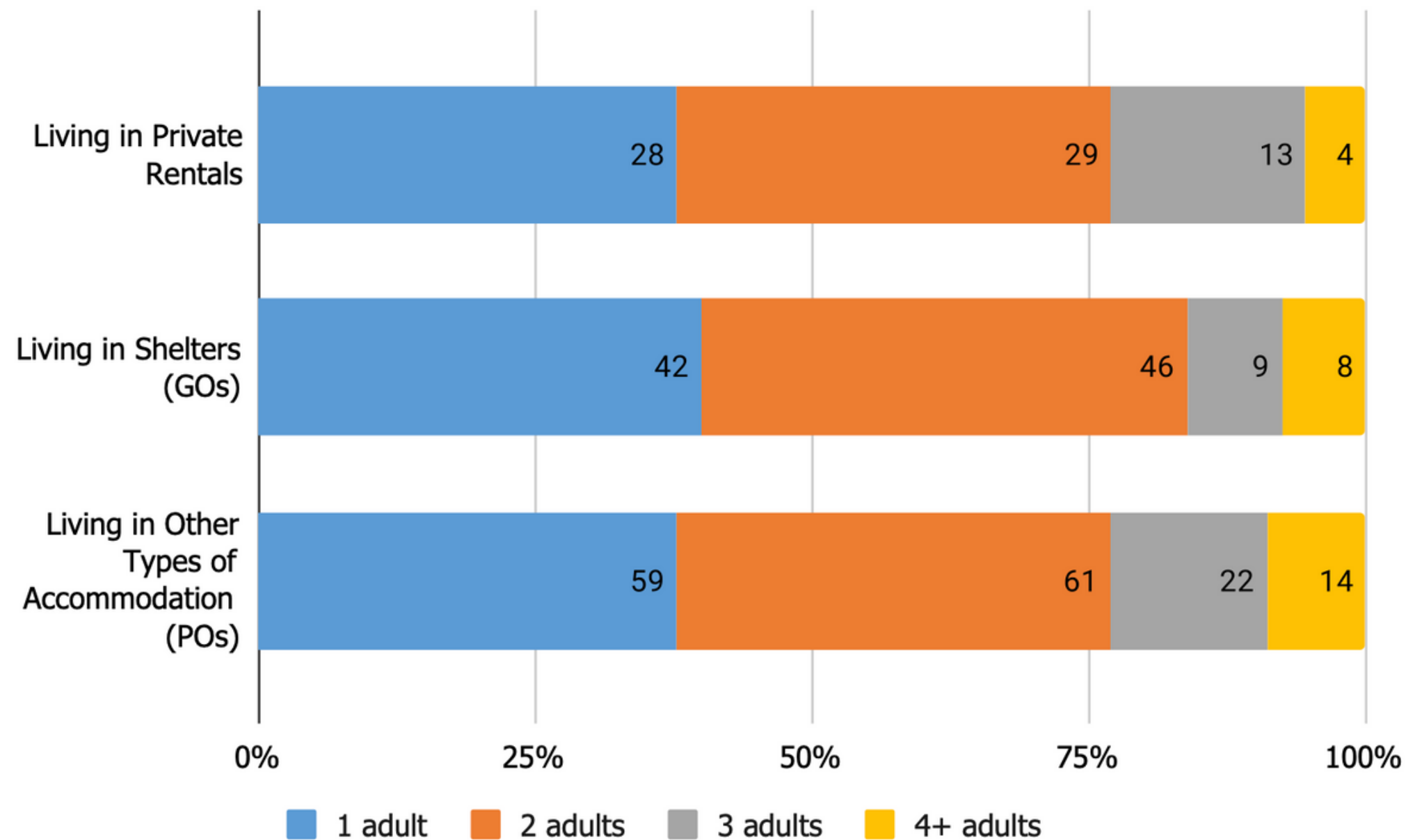
Although municipal workers lacked specific knowledge about forcibly displaced persons, they were skilled in crisis management.



Decentralised approach made the management and subsequent decisions very subjective and individual, but also it allowed for innovative and unconventional approaches to the organisation of reception.



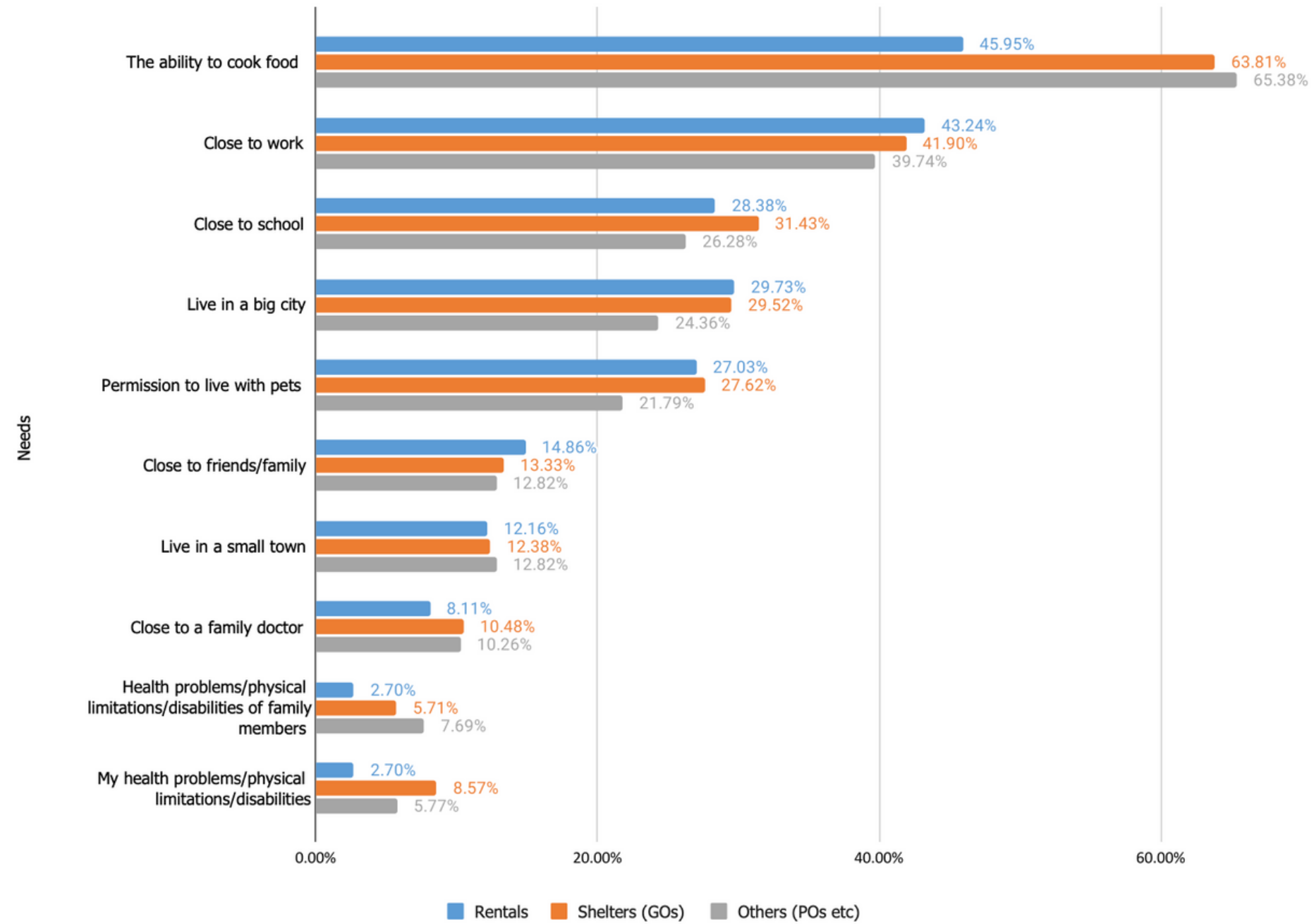
Experiences of displaced Ukrainian community



In our sample, 74 respondents (22%) live in privately rented accommodations, 105 respondents (31%) live in shelters provided by municipalities (GOs), while the remaining 156 respondents (47%) reported staying either with friends, family or host families (POs). The most common household composition consists of two or more adults (61% out of 335 respondents).

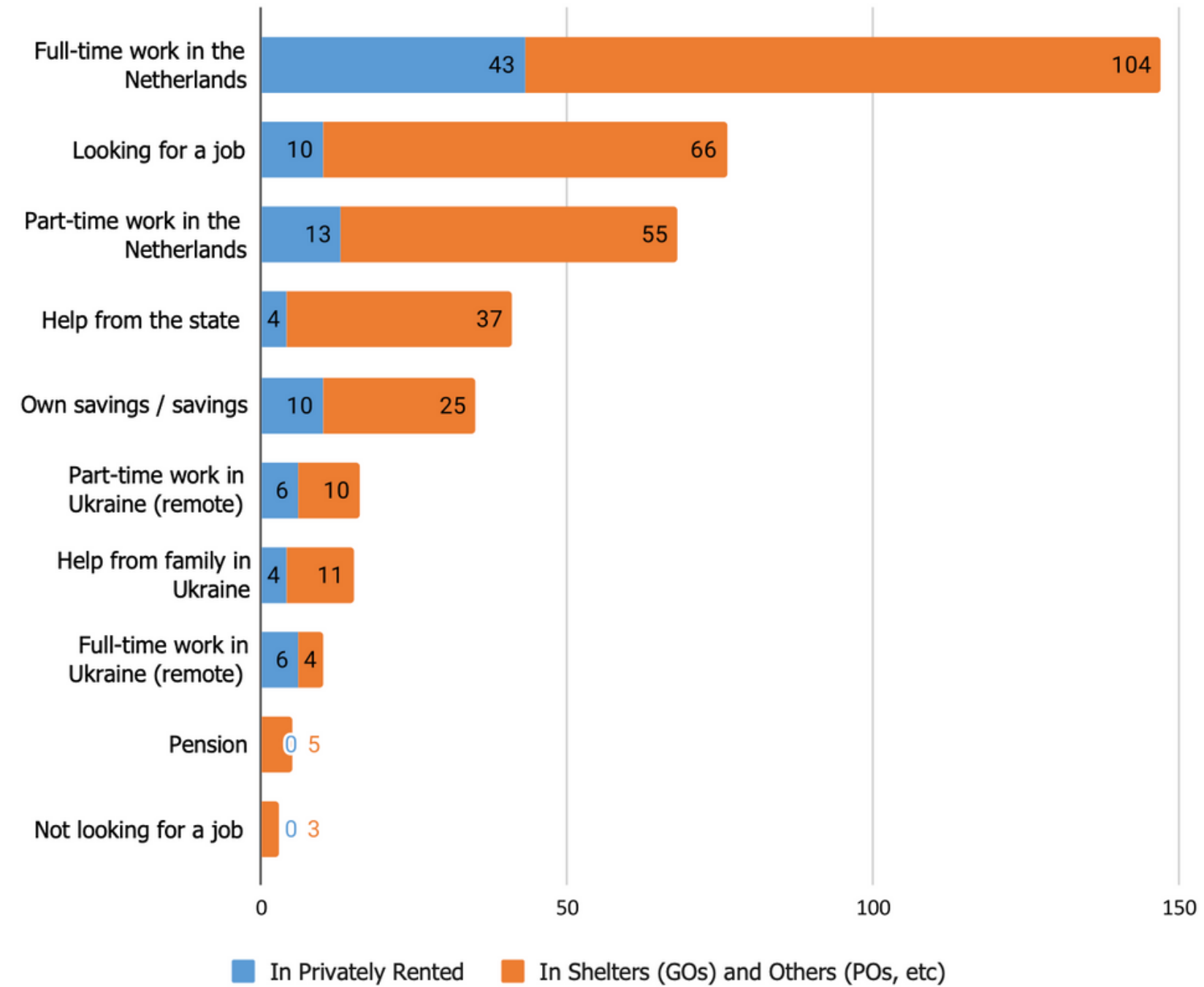


What are the needs of people in different types of housing?





Who managed to afford rented accomodation?



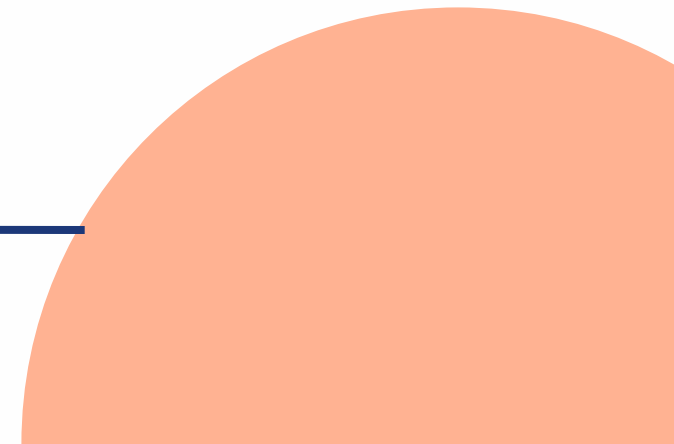

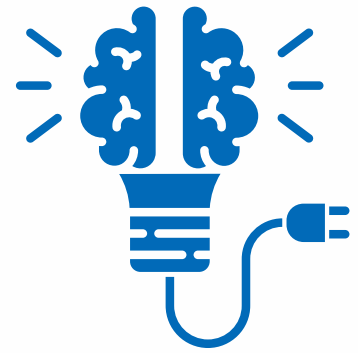
